Psalm 96. Cantate Domino.

- O SING unto the LORD a new song; * sing unto the LORD, all the whole earth.
- 2 Sing unto the LORD, and praise his Name; * be telling of his salvation from day to day.
- 3 Declare his honour unto the heathen, * and his wonders unto all peoples.
- 4 For the LORD is great, and cannot worthily be praised;* he is more to be feared than all gods.
- 5 As for all the gods of the heathen, they are but idols; * but it is the LORD that made the heavens.
- 6 Glory and worship are before him; * power and honour are in his sanctuary.
- 7 Ascribe unto the LORD, O ye kindreds of the peoples, * ascribe unto the LORD worship and power.
- 8 Ascribe unto the LORD the honour due unto his Name; * bring presents, and come into his courts.
- 9 O worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness; * let the whole earth stand in awe of him.
- 10 Tell it out among the heathen, that the LORD is King, and that it is he who hath made the round world so fast that it cannot be moved; * and how that he shall judge the peoples righteously.
- 11 Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad; * let the sea make a noise, and all that therein is.
- 12 Let the field be joyful, and all that is in it; * then shall all the trees of the wood rejoice before the LORD.
- 13 For he cometh, for he cometh to judge the earth; * and with righteousness to judge the world, and the peoples with his truth.

Psalm 118. Confitemini Domino.

- O GIVE thanks unto the LORD, for he is gracious; * because his mercy endureth for ever.
- 2 Let Israel now confess that he is gracious, * and that his mercy endureth for ever.
- 3 Let the house of Aaron now confess, * that his mercy endureth for ever.
- 4 Yea, let them now that fear the LORD confess, * that his mercy endureth for ever.
- 5 I called upon the LORD in trouble; * and the LORD heard me at large.
- 6 The LORD is on my side; * I will not fear what man doeth unto me.
- 7 The LORD taketh my part with them that help me; * therefore shall I see my desire upon mine enemies.
- 8 It is better to trust in the LORD, * than to put any confidence in man.
- 9 It is better to trust in the LORD, * than to put any confidence in princes.
- 10 All nations compassed me round about; * but in the Name of the LORD will I destroy them.
- 11 They kept me in on every side, they kept me in, I say, on every side; * but in the Name of the LORD will I destroy them.
- 12 They came about me like bees, and are extinct even as the fire among the thorns; * for in the Name of the LORD I will destroy them.
- 13 Thou hast thrust sore at me, that I might fall; * but the LORD was my help.
- 14 The LORD is my strength, and my song; * and is become my salvation.
- 15 The voice of joy and health is in the dwellings of the righteous; * the right hand of the

LORD bringeth mighty things to pass.

- 16 The right hand of the LORD hath the pre-eminence; * the right hand of the LORD bringeth mighty things to pass.
- 17 I shall not die, but live, * and declare the works of the LORD.
- 18 The LORD hath chastened and corrected me; * but he hath not given me over unto death.
- 19 Open me the gates of righteousness, * that I may go into them, and give thanks unto the LORD.
- 20 This is the gate of the LORD, * the righteous shall enter into it.
- 21 I will thank thee; for thou hast heard me, * and art become my salvation.
- 22 The same stone which the builders refused, * is become the head-stone in the comer.
- 23 This is the LORD'S doing, * and it is marvelous in our eyes.
- 24 This is the day which the LORD hath made; * we will rejoice and be glad in it.
- 25 Help me now, O LORD: * O LORD, send us now prosperity.
- 26 Blessed be he that cometh in the Name of the LORD: * we have wished you good luck, we that are of the house of the LORD.
- 27 God is the LORD, who hath showed us light: * bind the sacrifice with cords, yea, even unto the horns of the altar.
- 28 Thou art my God, and I will thank thee; * thou art my God, and I will praise thee.
- 29 O give thanks unto the LORD; for he is gracious, * and his mercy endureth for ever.

Psalms 8. Domine, Dominus noster.

- O LORD our Governor, how excellent is thy Name in all the world; * thou that hast set thy glory above the heavens!
- 2 Out of the mouth of very babes and sucklings hast thou ordained strength, because of thine enemies, * that thou mightest still the enemy and the avenger.
- 3 When I consider thy heavens, even the work of thy fingers; * the moon and the stars which thou hast ordained;
- 4 What is man, that thou art mindful of him? * and the son of man, that thou visitest him?
- 5 Thou madest him lower than the angels, * to crown him with glory and worship.
- 6 Thou makest him to have dominion of the works of thy hands; * and thou hast put all things in subjection under his feet:
- 7 All sheep and oxen; * yea, and the beasts of the field;
- 8 The fowls of the air, and the fishes of the sea; * and whatsoever walketh through the paths of the seas.
- 9 O LORD our Governor, * how excellent is thy Name in all the world!

Psalms 34. Benedicam Dominum.

- I WILL alway give thanks unto the LORD; * his praise shall ever be in my mouth.
- 2 My soul shall make her boast in the LORD; * the humble shall hear thereof, and be glad.
- 3 O praise the LORD with me, * and let us magnify his Name together.
- 4 I sought the LORD, and he heard me; * yea, he delivered me out of all my fear.
- 5 They had an eye unto him, and were lightened; * and their faces were not ashamed.
- 6 Lo, the poor crieth, and the LORD heareth him; * yea, and saveth him out of all his troubles.

- 7 The angel of the LORD tarrieth round about them that fear him, * and delivereth them.
- 8 O taste, and see, how gracious the LORD is: * blessed is the man that trusteth in him.
- 9 O fear the LORD, ye that are his saints; * for they that fear him lack nothing.
- 10 The lions do lack, and suffer hunger; * but they who seek the LORD shall want no manner of thing that is good.
- 11 Come, ye children, and hearken unto me; * I will teach you the fear of the LORD.
- 12 What man is he that lusteth to live, * and would fain see good days?
- 13 Keep thy tongue from evil, * and thy lips, that they speak no guile.
- 14 Eschew evil, and do good; * seek peace, and ensue it.
- 15 The eyes of the LORD are over the righteous, * and his ears are open unto their prayers.
- 16 The countenance of the LORD is against them that do evil, * to root out the remembrance of them from the earth.
- 17 The righteous cry, and the LORD heareth them, * and delivereth them out of all their troubles.
- 18 The LORD is nigh unto them that are of a contrite heart, * and will save such as be of an humble spirit.
- 19 Great are the troubles of the righteous; * but the LORD delivereth him out of all.
- 20 He keepeth all his bones, * so that not one of them is broken.
- 21 But misfortune shall slay the ungodly; * and they that hate the righteous shall be desolate.
- 22 The LORD delivereth the souls of his servants; * and all they that put their trust in him shall not be destitute.

Psalm 98. Cantate Domino.

- O SING unto the LORD a new song; * for he hath done marvelous things.
- 2 With his own right hand, and with his holy arm, * hath he gotten himself the victory.
- 3 The LORD declared his salvation; * his righteousness hath he openly showed in the sight of the heathen.
- 4 He hath remembered his mercy and truth toward the house of Israel; * and all the ends of the world have seen the salvation of our God.
- 5 Show yourselves joyful unto the LORD, all ye lands; * sing, rejoice, and give thanks.
- 6 Praise the LORD upon the harp; * sing to the harp with a psalm of thanksgiving.
- 7 With trumpets also and shawms, * O show yourselves joyful before the LORD, the King.
- 8 Let the sea make a noise, and all that therein is; * the round world, and they that dwell therein.
- 9 Let the floods clap their hands, and let the hills be joyful together before the LORD; * for he is come to judge the earth.
- 10 With righteousness shall he judge the world, * and the peoples with equity.

Psalm 103. Benedic, anima mea.

- PRAISE the LORD, O my soul; * and all that is within me, praise his holy Name.
- 2 Praise the LORD, O my soul, * and forget not all his benefits:
- 3 Who forgiveth all thy sin, * and healeth all thine infirmities;

- 4 Who saveth thy life from destruction, * and crowneth thee with mercy and loving-kindness;
- 5 Who satisfieth thy mouth with good things, * making thee young and lusty as an eagle.
- 6 The LORD executeth righteousness and judgment * for all them that are oppressed with wrong.
- 7 He showed his ways unto Moses, * his works unto the children of Israel.
- 8 The LORD is full of compassion and mercy, * longsuffering, and of great goodness.
- 9 He will not alway be chiding; * neither keepeth he his anger for ever.
- 10 He hath not dealt with us after our sins; * nor rewarded us according to our wickednesses.
- 11 For look how high the heaven is in comparison of the earth; * so great is his mercy also toward them that fear him.
- 12 Look how wide also the east is from the west; * so far hath he set our sins from us.
- 13 Yea, like as a father pitieth his own children; * even so is the LORD merciful unto them that fear him.
- 14 For he knoweth whereof we are made; * he remembereth that we are but dust.
- 15 The days of man are but as grass; * for he flourisheth as a flower of the field.
- 16 For as soon as the wind goeth over it, it is gone; * and the place thereof shall know it no more.
- 17 But the merciful goodness of the LORD endureth for ever and ever upon them that fear him; * and his righteousness upon children's children;
- 18 Even upon such as keep his covenant, * and think upon his commandments to do them.
- 19 The LORD hath prepared his seat in heaven, * and his kingdom ruleth over all.
- 20 O praise the LORD, ye angels of his, ye that excel in strength; * ye that fulfill his commandment, and hearken unto the voice of his word.
- 21 O praise the LORD, all ye his hosts; * ye servants of his that do his pleasure.
- 22 O speak good of the LORD, all ye works of his, in all places of his dominion: * praise thou the LORD, O my soul.

Psalm 92. Bonum est confiteri.

- IT is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, * and to sing praises unto thy Name, O Most Highest;
- 2 To tell of thy loving-kindness early in the morning, * and of thy truth in the night season;
- 3 Upon an instrument of ten strings, and upon the lute; * upon a loud instrument, and upon the harp.
- 4 For thou, LORD, hast made me glad through thy works; * and I will rejoice in giving praise for the operations of thy hands.
- 5 O LORD, how glorious are thy works! * thy thoughts are very deep.
- 6 An unwise man doth not well consider this, * and a fool doth not understand it.
- 7 When the ungodly are green as the grass, and when all the workers of wickedness do flourish, * then shall they be destroyed for ever; but thou, LORD, art the Most Highest for evermore.
- 8 For lo, thine enemies, O LORD, lo, thine enemies shall perish; * and all the workers of wickedness shall be destroyed.

- 9 But my horn shall be exalted like the horn of an unicorn; * for I am anointed with fresh oil.
- 10 Mine eye also shall see his lust of mine enemies, * and mine ear shall hear his desire of the wicked that arise up against me.
- 11 The righteous shall flourish like a palm-tree, * and shall spread abroad like a cedar in Lebanon.
- 12 Such as are planted in the house of the LORD, * shall flourish in the courts of the house of our God.
- 13 They also shall bring forth more fruit in their age, * and shall be fat and well-liking;
- 14 That they may show how true the LORD my strength is, * and that there is no unrighteousness in him.

Psalm 65. Te decet hymnus.

THOU, O God, art praised in Sion; * and unto thee shall the vow be performed in Jerusalem.

- 2 Thou that hearest the prayer, * unto thee shall all flesh come.
- 3 My misdeeds prevail against me: * O be thou merciful unto our sins.
- 4 Blessed is the man whom thou choosest, and receivest unto thee: * he shall dwell in thy court, and shall be satisfied with the pleasures of thy house, even of thy holy temple.
- 5 Thou shalt show us wonderful things in thy righteousness, O God of our salvation; * thou that art the hope of all the ends of the earth, and of them that remain in the broad sea
- 6 Who in his strength setteth fast the mountains, * and is girded about with power.
- 7 Who stilleth the raging of the sea, * and the noise of his waves, and the madness of the peoples.
- 8 They also that dwell in the uttermost parts of the earth shall be afraid at thy tokens, * thou that makest the out-goings of the morning and evening to praise thee.
- 9 Thou visitest the earth, and blessest it; * thou makest it very plenteous.
- 10 The river of God is full of water: * thou preparest their corn, for so thou providest for the earth.
- 11 Thou waterest her furrows; thou sendest rain into the little valleys thereof; * thou makest it soft with the drops of rain, and blessest the increase of it.
- 12 Thou crownest the year with thy goodness; * and thy clouds drop fatness.
- 13 They shall drop upon the dwellings of the wilderness; * and the little hills shall rejoice on every side.
- 14 The folds shall be full of sheep; * the valleys also shall stand so thick with corn, that they shall laugh and sing.

Psalms 29. Afferte Domino.

ASCRIBE unto the LORD, O ye mighty, * ascribe unto the LORD worship and strength. 2 Ascribe unto the LORD the honour due unto his Name; * worship the LORD with holy worship.

- 3 The voice of the LORD is upon the waters; * it is the glorious God that maketh the thunder.
- 4 It is the LORD that ruleth the sea; the voice of the LORD is mighty in operation; * the voice of the LORD is a glorious voice.

- 5 The voice of the LORD breaketh the cedar-trees; * yea, the LORD breaketh the cedars of Lebanon.
- 6 He maketh them also to skip like a calf; * Lebanon also, and Sirion, like a young unicorn.
- 7 The voice of the LORD divideth the flames of fire; the voice of the LORD shaketh the wilderness; * yea, the LORD shaketh the wilderness of Kadesh.
- 8 The voice of the LORD maketh the hinds to bring forth young, and strippeth bare the forests: * in his temple doth every thing speak of his honour.
- 9 The LORD sitteth above the water-flood, * and the LORD remaineth a King for ever. 10 The LORD shall give strength unto his people; * the LORD shall give his people the blessing of peace.

Psalm 149. Cantate Domino.

- O SING unto the LORD a new song; * let the congregation of saints praise him.
- 2 Let Israel rejoice in him that made him, * and let the children of Sion be joyful in their King.
- 3 Let them praise his Name in the dance: * let them sing praises unto him with tabret and harp.
- 4 For the LORD hath pleasure in his people, * and helpeth the meek-hearted.
- 5 Let the saints be joyful with glory; * let them rejoice in their beds.
- 6 Let the praises of God be in their mouth; * and a two-edged sword in their hands;
- 7 To be avenged of the nations, * and to rebuke the peoples;
- 8 To bind their kings in chains, * and their nobles with links of iron;
- 9 To execute judgment upon them; as it is written, * Such honour have all his saints.

Psalm 113. Laudate, pueri.

PRAISE the LORD, ye servants; * O praise the Name of the LORD.

- 2 Blessed be the Name of the LORD * from this time forth for evermore.
- 3 The LORD'S Name is praised * from the rising up of the sun unto the going down of the same.
- 4 The LORD is high above all nations, * and his glory above the heavens.
- 5 Who is like unto the LORD our God, that hath his dwelling so high, * and yet humbleth himself to behold the things that are in heaven and earth!
- 6 He taketh up the simple out of the dust, * and lifteth the poor out of the mire;
- 7 That he may set him with the princes, * even with the princes of his people.
- 8 He maketh the barren woman to keep house, * and to be a joyful mother of children.

Psalm 107. Confitemini Domino.

- O GIVE thanks unto the LORD, for he is gracious, * and his mercy endureth for ever.
- 2 Let them give thanks whom the LORD hath redeemed, * and delivered from the hand of the enemy;
- 3 And gathered them out of the lands, from the east, and from the west; * from the north, and from the south.
- 4 They went astray in the wilderness out of the way, * and found no city to dwell in.

- 5 Hungry and thirsty, * their soul fainted in them.
- 6 So they cried unto the LORD in their trouble, * and he delivered them from their distress.
- 7 He led them forth by the right way, * that they might go to the city where they dwelt.
- 8 O that men would therefore praise the LORD for his goodness; * and declare the wonders that he doeth for the children of men!
- 9 For he satisfieth the empty soul, * and filleth the hungry soul with goodness.
- 10 Such as sit in darkness, and in the shadow of death, * being fast bound in misery and iron;
- 11 Because they rebelled against the words of the Lord, * and lightly regarded the counsel of the Most Highest;
- 12 He also brought down their heart through heaviness: * they fell down, and there was none to help them.
- 13 SO when they cried unto the LORD in their trouble, * he delivered them out of their distress.
- 14 For he brought them out of darkness, and out of the shadow of death, * and brake their bonds in sunder.
- 15 O that men would therefore praise the LORD for his goodness; * and declare the wonders that he doeth for the children of men!
- 16 For he hath broken the gates of brass, * and smitten the bars of iron in sunder.
- 17 Foolish men are plagued for their offence, * and because of their wickedness.
- 18 Their soul abhorred all manner of meat, * and they were even hard at death's door.
- 19 So when they cried unto the LORD in their trouble, * he delivered them out of their distress.
- 20 He sent his word, and healed them; * and they were saved from their destruction.
- 21 O that men would therefore praise the LORD for his goodness; * and declare the wonders that he doeth for the children of men!
- 22 That they would offer unto him the sacrifice of thanksgiving, * and tell out his works with gladness!
- 23 They that go down to the sea in ships, * and occupy their business in great waters;
- 24 These men see the works of the LORD, * and his wonders in the deep.
- 25 For at his word the stormy wind ariseth, * which lifteth up the waves thereof.
- 26 They are carried up to the heaven, and down again to the deep; * their soul melteth away because of the trouble.
- 27 They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunken man, * and are at their wit's end.
- 28 SO when they cry unto the LORD in their trouble, * he delivereth them out of their distress.
- 29 For he maketh the storm to cease, * so that the waves thereof are still.
- 30 Then are they glad, because they are at rest; * and so he bringeth them unto the haven where they would be.
- 31 O that men would therefore praise the LORD for his goodness; * and declare the wonders that he doeth for the children of men!
- 32 That they would exalt him also in the congregation of the people, * and praise him in the seat of the elders!
- 33 He turneth the floods into a wilderness, * and drieth up the water-springs.
- 34 A fruitful land maketh he barren, * for the wickedness of them that dwell therein.

- 35 Again, he maketh the wilderness a standing water, * and water-springs of a dry ground.
- 36 And there he setteth the hungry, * that they may build them a city to dwell in;
- 37 That they may sow their land, and plant vineyards, * to yield them fruits of increase.
- 38 He blesseth them, so that they multiply exceedingly; * and suffereth not their cattle to decrease.
- 39 And again, when they are minished and brought low * through oppression, through any plague or trouble;
- 40 Though he suffer them to be evil entreated through tyrants, * and let them wander out of the way in the wilderness;
- 41 Yet helpeth he the poor out of misery, * and maketh him households like a flock of sheep.
- 42 The righteous will consider this, and rejoice; * and the mouth of all wickedness shall be stopped.
- 43 Whoso is wise, will ponder these things; * and they shall understand the loving-kindness of the LORD.

Psalm 147. Laudate Dominum.

PRAISE the LORD, for it is a good thing to sing praises unto our God; * yea, a joyful and pleasant thing it is to be thankful.

- 2 The LORD doth build up Jerusalem, * and gather together the outcasts of Israel.
- 3 He healeth those that are broken in heart, * and giveth medicine to heal their sickness.
- 4 He telleth the number of the stars, * and calleth them all by their names.
- 5 Great is our Lord, and great is his power; * yea, and his wisdom is infinite.
- 6 The LORD setteth up the meek, * and bringeth the ungodly down to the ground.
- 7 O sing unto the LORD with thanksgiving; * sing praises upon the harp unto our God:
- 8 Who covereth the heaven with clouds, and prepareth rain for the earth; * and maketh the grass to grow upon the mountains, and herb for the use of men;
- 9 Who giveth fodder unto the cattle, * and feedeth the young ravens that call upon him. 10 He hath no pleasure in the strength of an horse; * neither delighteth he in any man's legs.
- 11 But the LORD'S delight is in them that fear him, * and put their trust in his mercy. ~
- 12 Praise the LORD, O Jerusalem; * praise thy God, O Sion.
- 13 For he hath made fast the bars of thy gates, * and hath blessed thy children within thee.
- 14 He maketh peace in thy borders, * and filleth thee with the flour of wheat.
- 15 He sendeth forth his commandment upon earth, * and his word runneth very swiftly.
- 16 He giveth snow like wool, * and scattereth the hoarfrost like ashes.
- 17 He casteth forth his ice like morsels: * who is able to abide his frost?
- 18 He sendeth out his word, and melteth them: * he bloweth with his wind, and the waters flow.
- 19 He showeth his word unto Jacob, * his statutes and ordinances unto Israel.
- 20 He hath not dealt so with any nation; * neither have the heathen knowledge of his laws.

Psalms 33. Exultate, justi.

REJOICE in the LORD, O ye righteous; * for it becometh well the just to be thankful.

- 2 Praise the LORD with harp; * sing praises unto him with the lute, and instrument of ten strings.
- 3 Sing unto the Lord a new song; * sing praises lustily unto him with a good courage.
- 4 For the word of the LORD is true; * and all his works are faithful.
- 5 He loveth righteousness and judgment; * the earth is full of the goodness of the LORD.
- 6 By the word of the LORD were the heavens made; * and all the host of them by the breath of his mouth.
- 7 He gathereth the waters of the sea together, as it were upon an heap; * and layeth up the deep, as in a treasure-house.
- 8 Let all the earth fear the LORD: * stand in awe of him, all ye that dwell in the world.
- 9 For he spake, and it was done; * he commanded, and it stood fast.
- 10 The LORD bringeth the counsel of the heathen to nought, * and maketh the devices of the people to be of none effect, and casteth out the counsels of princes.
- 11 The counsel of the LORD shall endure for ever, * and the thoughts of his heart from generation to generation.
- 12 Blessed are the people whose God is the Lord JEHOVAH; * and blessed are the folk that he hath chosen to him, to be his inheritance.
- 13 The LORD looketh down from heaven, and beholdeth all the children of men; * from the habitation of his dwelling, he considereth all them that dwell on the earth.
- 14 He fashioneth all the hearts of them, * and understandeth all their works.
- 15 There is no king that can be saved by the multitude of an host; * neither is any mighty man delivered by much strength.
- 16 A horse is counted but a vain thing to save a man; * neither shall he deliver any man by his great strength.
- 17 Behold, the eye of the LORD is upon them that fear him, * and upon them that put their trust in his mercy;
- 18 To deliver their soul from death, * and to feed them in the time of dearth.
- 19 Our soul hath patiently tarried for the LORD; * for he is our help and our shield.
- 20 For our heart shall rejoice in him; * because we have hoped in his holy Name.
- 21 Let thy merciful kindness, O LORD, be upon us, * like as we do put our trust in thee.

Psalm 136. Confitemini.

- O GIVE thanks unto the LORD, for he is gracious: * and his mercy endureth for ever.
- 2 O give thanks unto the God of all gods: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 3 O thank the Lord of all lords: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 4 Who only doeth great wonders: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 5 Who by his excellent wisdom made the heavens: for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 6 Who laid out the earth above the waters: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 7 Who hath made great lights: * for his mercy endureth for ever:
- 8 The sun to rule the day: * for his mercy endureth for ever;
- 9 The moon and the stars to govern the night: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 10 Who smote Egypt, with their firstborn: * for his mercy endureth for ever;
- 11 And brought out Israel from among them: * for his mercy endureth for ever;
- 12 With a mighty hand and stretched-out arm: * for his mercy endureth for ever.

- 13 Who divided the Red Sea in two parts: * for his mercy endureth for ever;
- 14 And made Israel to go through the midst of it: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 15 But as for Pharaoh and his host, he overthrew them in the Red Sea: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 16 Who led his people through the wilderness: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 17 Who smote great kings: * for his mercy endureth for ever;
- 18 Yea, and slew mighty kings: * for his mercy endureth for ever:
- 19 Sihon, king of the Amorites: * for his mercy endureth for ever;
- 20 And Og, the king of Bashan: * for his mercy endureth for ever;
- 21 And gave away their land for an heritage: * for his mercy endureth for ever;
- 22 Even for an heritage unto Israel his servant: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 23 Who remembered us when we were in trouble: * for his mercy endureth for ever;
- 24 And hath delivered us from our enemies: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 25 Who giveth food to all flesh: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 26 O give thanks unto the God of heaven: * for his mercy endureth for ever.
- 27 O give thanks unto the Lord of lords: * for his mercy endureth for ever.

Psalms 45. Eructavit cor meum.

- MY heart overfloweth with a good matter; I speak the things which I have made concerning the King. * My tongue is the pen of a ready writer.
- 2 Thou art fairer than the children of men; * full of grace are thy lips, because God hath blessed thee for ever.
- 3 Gird thee with thy sword upon thy thigh, O thou Most Mighty, * according to thy worship and renown.
- 4 Good luck have thou with thine honour: * ride on, because of the word of truth, of meekness, and righteousness; and thy right hand shall teach thee terrible things.
- 5 Thy arrows are very sharp in the heart of the King's enemies, * and the people shall be subdued unto thee.
- 6 Thy seat, O God, endureth for ever; * the sceptre of thy kingdom is a right sceptre.
- 7 Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; * wherefore God, even thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows.
- 8 All thy garments smell of myrrh, aloes, and cassia; * out of the ivory palaces, whereby they have made thee glad.
- 9 Kings' daughters are among thy honourable women; * upon thy right hand doth stand the queen in a vesture of gold, wrought about with divers colours.
- 10 Hearken, O daughter, and consider; incline thine ear; * forget also thine own people, and thy father's house.
- 11 So shall the King have pleasure in thy beauty; * for he is thy Lord, and worship thou him.
- 12 And the daughter of Tyre shall be there with a gift; * like as the rich also among the people shall make their supplication before thee.
- 13 The King's daughter is all glorious within; * her clothing is of wrought gold.
- 14 She shall be brought unto the King in raiment of needlework: * the virgins that be her fellows shall bear her company, and shall be brought unto thee.
- 15 With joy and gladness shall they be brought, * and shall enter into the King's palace.

- 16 Instead of thy fathers, thou shalt have children, * whom thou mayest make princes in all lands.
- 17 I will make thy Name to be remembered from one generation to another; * therefore shall the people give thanks unto thee, world without end.

Psalm 67. Deus misereatur.

- GOD be merciful unto us, and bless us, * and show us the light of his countenance, and be merciful unto us;
- 2 That thy way may be known upon earth, * thy saving health among all nations.
- 3 Let the peoples praise thee, O God; * yea, let all the peoples praise thee.
- 4 O let the nations rejoice and be glad; * for thou shalt judge the folk righteously, and govern the nations upon earth.
- 5 Let the peoples praise thee, O God; * yea, let all the peoples praise thee.
- 6 Then shall the earth bring forth her increase; * and God, even our own God, shall give us his blessing.
- 7 God shall bless us; * and all the ends of the world shall fear him.

Psalm 97. Dominus regnavit.

- THE LORD is King, the earth may be glad thereof; * yea, the multitude of the isles may be glad thereof.
- 2 Clouds and darkness are round about him: * righteousness and judgment are the habitation of his seat.
- 3 There shall go a fire before him, * and burn up his enemies on every side.
- 4 His lightnings gave shine unto the world: * the earth saw it, and was afraid.
- 5 The hills melted like wax at the presence of the LORD; * at the presence of the Lord of the whole earth.
- 6 The heavens have declared his righteousness, * and all the peoples have seen his glory.
- 7 Confounded be all they that worship carved images, and that delight in vain gods: * worship him, all ye gods.
- 8 Sion heard of it, and rejoiced; and the daughters of Judah were glad, * because of thy judgments, O LORD.
- 9 For thou, LORD, art higher than all that are in the earth: * thou art exalted far above all gods.
- 10 O ye that love the LORD, see that ye hate the thing which is evil: * the Lord preserveth the souls of his saints; he shall deliver them from the hand of the ungodly.
- 11 There is sprung up a light for the righteous, * and joyful gladness for such as are true-hearted.
- 12 Rejoice in the LORD, ye righteous; * and give thanks for a remembrance of his holiness.

Psalm 100. Jubilate Deo.

- O BE joyful in the LORD, all ye lands: * serve the LORD with gladness, and come before his presence with a song.
- 2 Be ye sure that the LORD he is God; it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; * we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.

- 3 O go your way into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise; * be thankful unto him, and speak good of his Name.
- 4 For the LORD is gracious, his mercy is everlasting; * and his truth endureth from generation to generation.

Psalm 99. Dominus regnavit.

THE LORD is King, be the people never so impatient; * he sitteth between the Cherubim, be the earth never so unquiet.

- 2 The LORD is great in Sion, * and high above all people.
- 3 They shall give thanks unto thy Name, * which is great, wonderful, and holy.
- 4 The King's power loveth judgment; thou hast prepared equity, * thou hast executed judgment and righteousness in Jacob.
- 5 O magnify the LORD our God, and fall down before his footstool; * for he is holy.
- 6 Moses and Aaron among his priests, and Samuel among such as call upon his Name: * these called upon the LORD, and he heard them.
- 7 He spake unto them out of the cloudy pillar; * for they kept his testimonies, and the law that he gave them.
- 8 Thou heardest them, O LORD our God; * thou forgavest them, O God, though thou didst punish their wicked doings.
- 9 O magnify the LORD our God, and worship him upon his holy hill; * for the LORD our God is holy.

Psalm 150. Laudate Dominum.

- O PRAISE God in his sanctuary: * praise him in the firmament of his power.
- 2 Praise him in his noble acts: * praise him according to his excellent greatness.
- 3 Praise him in the sound of the trumpet: * praise him upon the lute and harp.
- 4 Praise him in the timbrels and dances: * praise him upon the strings and pipe.
- 5 Praise him upon the well-tuned cymbals: * praise him upon the loud cymbals.
- 6 Let every thing that hath breath * praise the LORD.
